

DECISIONS OF EXECUTIVE COMMISSION 2022

CLERK OF ASSEMBLY

1. The Executive Commission instructs those Presbyteries and individuals who have not been attending the consultations to do so.
2. The Executive Commission resolves:
 - a. that the General Assembly 2023 will be held with the bounds of the Presbytery of Zimbabwe.
 - b. That the dates for General Assembly 2023 are **24th to 30th June 2023**.
3. The Executive Commission resolves that all reports are to be submitted by the due date, and any report submitted after the due date will only be heard by the relevant Council if it agrees to do so.
4. The Executive Commission notes the status regarding the papers of the General Assembly and Executive Commission.
5. The Executive Commission notes the renaming of Welkom, Durban and Randparkridge Congregations to Prof. Vuyani Vellem Memorial, VH Mabaso Congregations and Church on Tin Road respectively.
6. The Executive Commission notes the report concerning the ongoing management of Tiyo Soga House.
7. The Executive Commission notes the Changes in the Ministry as contained in the papers of Executive Commission 2022.

It was proposed, seconded and agreed that the Trans Xhariep section should fall off as it was not a change in ministry, and that Rev. Mapheto is not a minister in the UPCSA and therefore should reapply and follow the right processes if he wishes to be a minister of the UPCSA again.

8. The Executive Commission grants the Rev Russell Petersen the status of Minister Emeritus from 28 January 2023 and a seat on the Presbytery within whose bounds he may reside.
9. The Executive Commission grants the Rev David Smit the status of Minister Emeritus from 28 February 2023 and a seat on the Presbytery within whose bounds he may reside.
10. The Executive Commission grants the Rev Natalie Barnard the status of Minister Emeritus from 31 December 2022 and a seat on the Presbytery within whose bounds she may reside.
