- Confidence-killers in our lives such as, the rat race, the comparisons, the lack.
- Confidence-killers in our relationships such as rejection, opposition, betrayal, abuse.

- Confidence-killers in our own minds such as, feelings of inadequacy, inferiority, insecurities, low self-esteem, impostor syndrome.

 Confidence-killers even in our churches such as, the superior, the judgemental, the arrogant and the degraders of others.

For every confidence killer we face, we need a confidence booster. Unfortunately there are no lasting and ultimate confidence boosters in our pharmacies or home remedies. However, the best confidence booster is available to you. Peter found it on the day of Pentecost when he suddenly raised his voice and spoke up and said:

"Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. These people are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: 'In the last days,' God says, 'I will pour out my Spirit on all people.'

(Acts 2:14-16)

Peter's confidence booster came in the form of a non-tangible tonic called the Holy Spirit! When this tonic came upon Peter, he took on the kind of confidence that he had never imagined he was capable of. He rose up, picked up his head, raised his shoulders, looked at the crowd of scoffers, projected his voice, and spoke confidently to them.

He spoke boldly though he knew that the crowds were criticizing the manifestation of the Spirit on the believers as they were speaking in various tongues.

- 1,846 incidents in schools and hospitals.

This is the blessed generation, that God loves, and who are the future of the universe. Similarly, the month of June celebrates the Day of Parents. UPCSA Exercising a Prophetic Witness to Christ

The second part of the vision of the UPCSA states that the reconciled community of Christians should exercise "a prophetic witness to Christ". So much work needs to be done by way of defining what is implied by "prophetic witness", who should exercise a "prophetic witness", when and in what circumstances the "prophetic witness" is called for. The answers to the questions

are not difficult and are not hidden. They lie in the knowledge of Jesus Christ holding an office of a prophet, as much as he also held the offices of a royalty and priesthood. Jesus Christ as a prophet anchored his witness on Isaiah 61: 1-2, as recorded in Luke 4: 18-19.

The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.

The Kairos Document 1985 discussed state theology, church theology and prophetic theology. In the document, it was stated clearly that state theology and church theology worked to defend the status quo and did not promote the interests of the poor. Albert Nolan argued that prophetic theology had to be based on social analysis, the understanding of how social relations should be constructed. based on a hermeneutics of the Word of God. It is a theology that brings a message of hope. The oppressed, the marginalized, the denigrated, the unemployed youth, the abused women and the child headed families are inspired by knowing that God is on the side of the oppressed.

Through prophetic theology, the masses were encouraged to understanding what God is saying at the "particular moment of time" – the Kairos, and to be able to read the signs of the times. Then, they would be able to say something about the future. Prophetic theology can predict the future catastrophes if nothing is done now, and it can promise great blessing if

the present opportunity is taken seriously.

Prophetic theology must be a theology that begins in action, and not as mere theory, and ends in a new kind of action. The document called for the people to take part in shaping the events and realizing their liberation. It called for transformation of the churches' activities and the development of programmes of empowerment. The church must also take part in the moral transformation of the society and promote the "ministry of involvement and participation."

The UPCSA congratulates the South African nation for conducting free and fair elections. It appreciates the populace for exercising their right to elect the government of their choice. The voice of the people has been heard. The request goes to the politicians and the political parties to respect the will of the people.

With the results of the recent South African elections, the geopolitics of the Southern African region, in which the UPCSA exists and operates is set to change considerably. The region is going to see a different sociopolitical, economic, and even spiritual landscape.

The UPCSA is called to exercise a prophetic witness at such a time as this. The Church in Society Committee has been requested to facilitate sessions that will determine the involvement and participation of the UPCSA in the explorations of the new terrains and frontiers. We cannot spectate in this

venture. Our interests should be that of the gospel, the poor (and all) should hear the good news, freedom should be proclaimed to the prisoners, the blind should recover their sight, the oppressed must be freed and the year of the Lord's favour must be proclaimed.

The UPCSA is forging ahead with the preparations for the CWM Assembly in Durban and the Executive Commission. The denomination is called to prayer for the two events.

We were very excited to offer this in Pentecost Week and were thrilled at the positive responses we have received.


We had over 90 people who attended the feedback Sessions but, because the talks and sessions are available on You Tube, the influence of the conference continues and you can see the videos on https://wp.me/p8nC5n-uG. Some of our videos have had over 250 views.

Our first keynote was by Rev Rod Botsis who spoke about the Spirituality of Leaders, placing emphasis on the fact that we find ourselves in the same place as the first century church and that we need to be "with Jesus", filled with the

Spirit and ready to boldly proclaim the Resurrected Christ.

Our second keynote was by our Moderator, the Rt Rev Lydia Neshangwe, who spoke about keeping the fire going in our hearts and the need for REVIVAL. Tom Jordi, a familiar friend of the UPCSA and youth specialist, gave the third keynote and spoke about how we reach our young people in the context we find ourselves in today. His talk focused on four fundamental areas: Identity, Grace, Purpose and Influence. It's a vitally important talk to listen to if we are serious about our young people.











We had three workshops and people could attend two:

- 1. George Marchinkowski hosted a discussion about trends in church growth and the shifts needed in our changing society and the core values of acceptance and hospitality that will play a key role.
- 2. Stewart Gordon and Theo Groeneveld hosted a discussion about the need for Discipleship (Spiritual Formation or Christian Education) in our congregations and practical ways to implement this.
- 3. Amon Kasambala hosted a discussion about Partnering with God in Mission and the key principles of being a missional church.

In the final session Theo Groeneveld reported on the UPCSA Going for Growth

Project and the work of the Mission and Discipleship Committee.

Synod of Zambia Fellowship of Menfaith Clinic Presentation

TOPIC: THE IMPORTANCE OF PENTECOST FOR THE 21ST CENTURY BELIEVER ACTS 2:1-4

THEME BREAKDOWN:

a. The word 'importance' from an oxford dictionary means

- something of great significance or value.
- b. The word Pentecost and what it means: Pentecost comes from a Greek word 'Pentecostes' which simply means the 50th day or day 50 from the day of Jesus resurrection.
- c. Why look at a believer in a 21st century? A believer is a follower of Christ or a follower of God the creator. The day of Pentecost is about those that believe in Jesus Christ but also those who will later on believe.

What then does it mean when we say "the importance of Pentecost" for the 21st believer?

- ✓ Pentecost is about the importance of the 50th day when the Holy Spirit was introduced to the believers in the world.
- ✓ This is not to say that the Holy Spirit has not been around. In fact, the Bible gives a clear account about the presence of the Holy Spirit in the world. In Genesis 1:2 the Holy Spirit is mentioned as being present on earth hovering over the water's surface.
- ✓ Other scriptures that talk about the presence of the Holy Spirit in the Old Testament includes: Psalm 51:11; Judges 14:6; 1st Samuel 16:13; Psalm 104:30; Judges 14:6; 1st Samuel 16:13; Psalm 104:30; Numbers 27:18; Genesis 6:3....

Instead Pentecost as a day the Holy Spirit came is simply the beginning of a new era in which the Holy Spirit is given full charge to operate from God the Trinity. As generally observed by Biblical scholars this is a third era after the era of

God the Father and the son (Jesus Christ). In Isaiah 9 we hear the echoing of God the Father announcing the coming of Jesus, while in John 16 Jesus announces the coming of the Holy Spirit as our helper. Therefore, this topic on "the importance of Pentecost for the 21st century believer" gives two impressions:

- 1. The first impression is that it points to the importance of the day of Pentecost as the day when the Holy Spirit came.
- 2. The second impression is that it suggests addressing 'the importance of the Holy Spirit' (though in an indirect way to a believer).

NOTE: in this Presentation my focus is on the first impression of the day of Pentecost. I know that they could be some expectation by this audience that I talk about the "importance of the Holy spirit" which I think can be another topic on its own. But I think understanding the importance of the Day of Pentecost is also very important before we can even look at the importance of the Holy Spirit in terms of his role, task or work in a life of a believer.

FOCUS OF THIS PRESENTATION:

Therefore, this presentation is about the importance of the day of Pentecost to a believer today. As earlier indicated before Pentecost the Holy Spirit had been working on earth and using different kinds of people. Looking at the day of Pentecost as a new era means acknowledging that believers can now embrace the Holy Spirit in their lives. And since the Holy Spirit has the spirit nature he is everywhere impacting whoever believes across the globe. Jesus had to leave the earth because upon completing his mission in the fresh through his birth, passion, death and resurrection he was

limited in physical location. The coming of the Holy Spirit means being limitless to reach out believers across the globe.


WHY THEN IS THE DAY OF PENTECOST IMPORTANT?

1. IT IS A BEGINNING OF A NEW ERA:

- A new era has characteristics of influencing new ways of looking at life or things.
- New era demands new ways of doing things or thinking.
- New era demand readiness to embrace change.
- New era means aligning ourselves to the demands of the Holy Spirit.

CHALLENGE:

"Today we still have churches and believers that are not willing to embrace



change and new ways in which the Holy Spirit operate."

A story of a Zambian Presbyterian Church:

****The Church lost a number of young men and women (most especially Youths) to other churches through resistance to what the Holy Spirit does when given the Space. These young people went after Pentecostal Churches that embraced mass prayers; churches that embraced miracles and deliverance services; churches that embraced worshiping in tongues and many more ways of operating in the Spirit.

It is also important to understand that amidst the Holy Spirit Era Satan has also embraced this era by duplicating the operations of the Holy Spirit in some ways. In our 21st Spirit era believers have witnessed the worst forms of abuse. And these includes: abuse of women in the name of the Holy Spirit; Some people have been made to eat grass; to drink detergent for healing; miracle money; being stepped upon for deliverance these and many more.

QUOTION:

There is a possibility that the mainline Churches could focus on these negativities and became extreme in traditions that hinder the operation of the Holy Spirit. And to borrow the words of Dr. Amon Kasambala (2024 @ Faith Clinic) that all we need is a balance between tradition and embracing the new era of the Holy Spirit.

2. PENTECOST IS A DAY OF PROMOTION/ UPLIFTMENT FOR A BELIEVER ACROSS THE GLOBE:

- John 16:7: "But very truly I tell you, it if for good that I am going away. Unless I go away, the advocate/ helper will not come to you, but if I go, I will send him to you." *****Pentecost is the day of believer's empowerment.

Yes, Jesus came physically on earth, he was born, he suffered, died and role. The Holy Spirit came in a spiritual body and he is omnipresent (he is everywhere). In the remarks by Rev. Richard Makandawire (2024 @ Faith Clinic) the importance of Pentecost is also based on the power that comes in the life of a believer, that enabling ability to do exploits as emphasized in Romans 8:9 and Acts 1:8.

3. PEOPLE THAT EMBRACE PENTECOST CHOOSE TO BE EXTRA ORDINARY:

Acts 2:7

Vs. 7. Utterly amazed, they asked; aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? Yet they could hear them in all their own languages. The Holy Spirit is able to make us reach out to people of various background and needs. He is God and is not limited by human boundaries of race and ethnicity.

In a new era:

Sons, daughters, men and women are extra ordinary:

- Sons and daughters will prophesy
 - Acts 2:17-18
- Young men will see visions
- Men and women will be empowered by the Holy Spirit.

According to Madam Songelo Mkandawire (2014 @ Faith Clinic) the importance of Pentecost reminds us of how often time as believers we do confess our faith in God yet deny the power of the Holy Spirit which should affirm that which we claim to profess. This resonated with the question that Mr. Sunga Mkandawire asked (2024 @ Faith

Clinic) on "How could we possibly embrace being extra ordinary as believers through the Holy Spirit working in our lives?" For me I think there has to be a deliberate approach within us as believers to desire to see the Holy Spirit work in our lives but this begins with accepting that we are in a new era of the Holy Spirit. We can allow the Holy Spirit to use us in an extra ordinary way by the way we pray; the way we use our gift and even the way we present ourselves at the work places.

4. FINALLY, PEOPLE OR THE CHURCH THAT EMBRACES PENTECOST AS A NEW ERA THEY DO EXPERIENCE:

- Spiritual and Physical growth
- The presence and power of the Holy Spirit.
- Extra ordinary operations of the Holy Spirit.

NO DOUBT WE ARE IN A NEW ERA OF THE HOLY SPIRIT AND IF WE CAN EMBRACE THE ERA WE SHALL EXPERIENCE THE WORKS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT IN OUR LIVES.

As rightly pointed out by Rev. Chala Habasila (2024 @ Faith Clinic) there is consistence in God the trinity leading to the new era of the Holy Spirit. For example in John 16 Jesus announces the coming of the Holy Spirit in affirming what the Father had already mentioned and promised in the book of Joel 3 that in the last days he shall pour out his spirit on all fresh, which is later mentioned in Acts 2 at Pentecost.

Further Study on the Pentecost and the Holy Spirit:

There is still a lot of what we need to learn regarding the importance of

Pentecost day and the Holy Spirit as presented in the four gospels. For example, one of the questions that came from Mr Kasalu, Mr Chirwa and Rev.



Lazarus Chirwa as to whether the day of Pentecost was the only time or day that the Holy Spirit was given to Jesus disciples or believers considering John 20:22 which talks about Jesus breathing on his disciples so that they can revive the Holy Spirit?

- Equip participants with biblical tools for everyday life


- Promote a culture of compassion, empathy, and service to others








Duncan Village Congregation



Greetings from the PEF Task Team of the Education and Training Committee in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

The General Assembly decided the third Sunday of June, or Congregations may choose any Sunday, as PEF Sunday, and requested all Congregations to hold a retiring offering for the PEF on that Sunday or another of the Congregation's choice.

The PEF needs your help!

The PEF Task Team wishes to thank all the Congregations who managed to make donations during the 2022/2023 financial year. Your support is invaluable to us and to the young Presbyterians who have benefited from this worthy cause.

We hope that those who could not donate in previous years will make an effort to support us this year. Of course, we are still about six weeks away from the financial year end and we are hoping to receive some donations before closing the year. This is so as to close our financial year with a good bank balance and enough to pay for the beneficiaries. Of course, donations are still welcome after June.

So far in the 2023/2024 the PEF has made 9 awards, totaling R 82 180.00, and are hoping to make more payments before the end of the 2023/2024 financial year end. This will include payments for Zambia and Zimbabwe.

As can be seen above, there was a drop in disbursements made compared to the previous years because of a drop in donations received.

However, we were able to pay out this amount because we received support from the congregations, the Robert Niven Trust and larger donations from individuals, Fellowships, specifically FOY. These have made a huge difference in payments for Presbyterian children, yet the need is even greater than before. It grows each year! Congregations and Presbyteries have donated over R 57 830.00 in 2023/2024 and Individuals, Trust and the Fellowship of Youth (FOY) R 82 355,25, so *far this current financial year*. A total of R 140 185,85 and is a 44.0% drop from the last financial year.

We need every congregation in the UPCSA to consider their gifts to the PEF, and to donate **at least R 1000.00** per congregation to ensure that we have enough to cover the amounts still to be paid out before the end of the year, and to form the basis of the amounts that will be paid out in the 2024 academic year.

We urge the Congregations to please make every effort to make some donation, and if your donation has remained at the same amount for the past number of years, please prayerfully consider increasing the amount.

It would also be advisable to include the PEF Sunday in the Year Plans and not make PEF a 'by the way' when a PEF Sunday letter arrives.

It must be remembered that the PEF is the only social responsibility project of the UPCSA, so your donation is important to realize this cause.

The PEF Task Team members are available to do presentations at Congregations or at any gathering when invited. Please feel free to invite us by calling the Administrator at the Central Office number below, or by emailing your request for an invitation on the email address below.

A special thanks to the individual donors who are consistent in their monthly donations by making sure the debit orders go through every month without fail.

A big thank you to the Tiyo Soga Memorial Presbytery for taking the lead in their donations for 2024. They are consistent in their support. We received R11 671.50 from 19 Congregations on the 23 April 2024. Keep up the good work Tiyo Soga Memorial
